⇒ **Every Thursday at 11:00 am in the Chapel is Rosary. Please bring a fellow believer to join in rosary prayer.**



January is Glaucoma Awareness Month

Glaucoma is an eye disease that gradually steals sight without warning.

Vision loss is caused by damage to the optic nerve. According to the Glaucoma Research Foundation, this nerve acts like an electric cable with over a million wires. It is responsible for carrying images from the eye to the brain.

Although there is no cure for glaucoma yet, medication or surgery can slow or prevent further vision loss. The appropriate treatment depends upon the type of glaucoma among other factors. Early detection is vital to stopping the progress of the disease.

Glaucoma is the second leading cause of blindness in the world, according to the World Health Organization. In the most common form, there are virtually no symptoms.

Vision loss begins with peripheral or side vision, so if you have glaucoma, you may not notice anything until significant vision is lost.

The best way to protect your sight from glaucoma is to get a comprehensive eye examination. Then, if you have glaucoma, treatment can begin immediately.
