

FRANK GITRE'S YEARS OF S. MANITOU ISLAND FISHING TRIPS



It was approximately 1951 when a friend of my friend, Bob Kull, Jack Jinks, was able to purchase the fishing rights in Lake Michigan surrounding S.Manitou Island. This purchase included a small cottage on S.Manitou Island. My friend Bob Kull then purchased the cottage from Jack for \$350.00.

Fortunately for 10-12 guys who were Bob's friends we were included in memorable fishing trips for about 70 years!

Every Memorial day a group of the men would go up north to Leland, park the cars & travel 17 miles out into Lake Michigan on a 58' cabin cruiser, always hoping for a calm day for the trip. Sometimes the gang would be tossed around by the waves! On most trips to the island we would stop at the "crib" where the lighthouse was located & we would help unload necessary supplies for the men stationed in the lighthouse.

After we arrived we would proceed to clean the cottage up a little, unload supplies, grab the fishing poles & bait & spend a great day on the inland Lake (Lake Florence) shooting the breeze, enjoying the occasional cold beer & catching our share of fresh perch & some bass.

Because there was no electricity on the island Bob & I would do most of the cooking on a rigged up fire pit. There were gas lights in the cottage. Of course typical meals included baked potatoes, fresh fish & whatever else was available. Oh, I can still almost taste those fresh fish!!! Some of the guys would bring casseroles & other such meals that I'm sure were prepared by their wives! We had plenty to eat!

Occasionally our family would go up to the island & spend a week with our 2 children, who learned to drive on the island. There were 2 cars on the island; a 1955 Chevy & a 1960 Pontiac. It was such a safe place for the kids to learn; no traffic, no pedestrians & they could only go so far! The grown up kids still talk about those trips!

When the wives & all the men would go up to the island on Labor Day weekends the sleeping arrangements were hap-hazard to say the least. There were a bunch of mattresses stacked up in the cottage & they were flopped all over on the floor & out on the beach. One of the guys & his wife even tried sleeping in the nearby lighthouse till the wind blew the mattress all over the place!

I look back now on all the memorable weekends on that special little island out in Lake Michigan that meant so much for the 10-12 couples for about 70 years!

The government has now taken over the island so people must apply for camping permits, hiking trips, & any other reasons to visit <u>OUR S.</u> Manitou Island!

P.S. The 2nd largest Cedar tree in the U.S. is located on the island.


