

Dear Mr. Kisandi:

Thank you for writing. I respect your right to disagree with me on the issues of abortion and tobacco, as on any other issues. It is interesting to note how many who are all for "freedom of choice" when it comes to taking the life of a child seem dead set against it when it comes to an adult choosing to smoke.

Tobacco smoking occured on these shores long before there was a tobacco program-- or even a country. I think we can presume it will continue, tobacco program or not.

Smoking should be the free choice of an informed adult. There is no way this choice can be equated with abortion— in which no one asks the aborted baby for his or her opinion. Abortion, unlike smoking, is 100% fatal.

As for the health issue, HEW had this to say about the tobacco program: "if the (tobacco) program has any effect at all on public health \underline{it} is $\underline{favorable}$."
